### < Examples >

In fiscal 2014, Nissin Electric was officially received the “Kyoto Biodiversity and Culture Joint Restoration Project” certification from Kyoto City.

We have worked on increasing greening in consideration of biodiversity.

At our Head Office & Works, we have been growing plants associated with the culture of Kyoto, such as Futaba-aoi <sup>\*1</sup>(*Asarum caulescens*), Hiougi (*Belamcanda chinensis*) and Iroha-momiji (*Acer palmatum*).

We grew and propagated Futaba-aoi from roots provided by Kamigamo-jinja. In May 2016, we participated in dedication ceremony for Futaba-aoi held at Kamigamo-jinja.

We plan to continue to maintain and manage our Futaba-aoi so that they can be dedicated every year, and hope the plants grown at Nissin Electric will help to enliven the Aoi Festival, which is one of the three biggest imperial festivals in Kyoto.

### <Future issues>

Continuous commitment to the “Kyoto Biodiversity and Culture Joint Restoration Project” on the Nissin Electric Group site, expansion of planting areas, and work on biodiversity conservation activities, including the preservation of ecosystems unique to each region.
