#### ● PaperLab dry-process office papermaking system

Epson developed dry fiber technology to enable in-office paper recycling, promoting the effective use of forest resources and realizing the local production of paper for local consumption.

In addition to office use, Epson is working with partners in co-creation projects to use PaperLabs to recycle community paper resources locally.

### Programs Tailored to Community Needs

#### ● Loggerhead turtle nesting and hatching support (Spain)

This project is focused on improving nesting conditions for loggerhead turtles and protecting their eggs.

Weather-resistant banners were printed using an Epson printer to inform and educate both locals and tourists about the conservation effort, contributing to the maintenance and recovery of the loggerhead turtle species.
